Faith, Trust and Authenticity

When our two oldest were ages six and four, we moved 45 minutes from our previous neighborhood. Since the move, I missed my friend dearly and my kiddos missed their favorite playmates. So, when she invited us for a lunch date my son and daughter were excited to play with their friends, nearly as much as I was looking forward to the visit. About 10 minutes into the drive, the two started agitating each other. Their taunts kept increasing in volume, even after I told them to stop their bickering. Another five minutes went by and they kept at it, so I told them if they didn't stop, I was taking the nearest exit and turning around to go home.

Most of us who are parents or have an active role with children, have been in a similar predicament. I had to make a swift decision—to be true to my word or to let my statement fall into the 'empty threats' bucket. As much as I wanted to keep our commitment, I knew that building trust between my children and me depended on my authenticity and subsequent actions. This is similar to the trust relationship between us and God. Jesus spoke to this in his Sermon on the Mount. In Matthew 7:21 Jesus teaches, "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven." In order to deepen our faith in God we need to trust in God's wisdom and guidance and be authentic in our actions. When our desire to serve people in the community sprouts organically, our special relationship with God is evident. It reveals the core of whose we are—God's children and who we are—God's servants; a revelation that isn't lost on the recipients of our efforts.

Fortunately, there are many ways to serve and if you find the activity doesn't come natural to you or it doesn't fit your schedule, consider doing something else. After all, nobody likes a crabby volunteer. Oh, and by the way, I turned around and drove home.

Addiction is the number one health crisis facing our society today, and it is continually growing worse. The Zion Foundation is proud to sponsor The Center of Addiction and Faith.

They are an interfaith fellowship of thousands nationwide with the mission to address the addiction crisis with the healing power of faith, science, justice and compassion. Starting in 2018, they have held 4 conferences that bring people together with top teachers in addiction science, highly respected speakers on addiction, and the important role the church plays in recovery. They believe, as many do in the addiction treatment field, that faith plays an essential role in the healing process. While it is not completely understood why, it is generally accepted that medicine and therapy alone will not help those struggling with addiction, unless there is a faith component. Many people of faith believe that no one is better equipped than the church, to share and teach about God's unconditional love, acceptance, inclusion, and healing. From the Creation Care Team

Thanksgiving! What are you thankful or grateful for in God's Creation? Family, food, shelter, education are some of many notions that come to mind, but what if we simplify? What about water? Good, clean, refreshing water is essential for all life, including animals (human), plants, fungi and it holds a sacred place in our relationship with God. As we are stewards of His creation, protecting Earth's water is imperative. So, what are some ideas to take care and show appreciation for the water that surrounds us?

- 1. Care for the water body (i.e. river, lake, ocean) or better yet, the watershed near you. Learn about the Upper Mississippi Watershed and the industrial and agricultural stresses that effect negatively on the quality of, and consequently, the life that depends on that water. Pick up trash around waterways.
- 2. Don't dump down storm drains and keep storm drains near your homes and businesses clear of leaves, debris and litter. You can officially adopt a storm drain at https://mn.adopt-a-drain.org/.
- 3. Use less single-use plastic. The biggest source of pollution in the ocean is plastic and by using less plastic you are helping to keep God's oceans clean. Easy ways to reduce your plastic footprint are carrying reusable bags to stores, use reusable water bottles instead of one-time plastic bottles, packing your kid's lunches in reusable containers and lunchboxes, etc.
- 4. Use less water both in your home and outside. How can you reduce water usage in your everyday activities such as: brushing your teeth, taking a shower, doing laundry, watering lawn and garden, washing the car? Show your thanks and appreciation for the gift of water by keeping it clean and accessible to all God's Creation.

From the Addiction Awareness Ministry (ZAAM)

Our ministry team continues to explore, learn and share information on faith and addictions. On October 22, our guest speaker provided community information on opioid addiction (fentanyl) and the use of the antidote, naloxone (narcan) to prevent overdose deaths. Information from this event will be available in the Faith and Addiction section of our library. We have been reaching out to local facilities that specialize in addiction care. We will be scheduling future tours in order for us to be informed of available local resources. Our ministry team meets at 6:30 p.m. on the fourth Tuesday each month. All are welcome.
