Ash Wednesday is March 5. Worship times will be at noon & 6:30 p.m. and we will have the imposition of ashes and Holy Communion as part of both services. Our mid-week Lenten theme this year is: *Unbroken: A Living Faith.*

What are the foundational beliefs and how are they living and moving with us as we change and grow? Faith is passed down from generation to generation. Hanging in There

It was well into winter when I noticed a single leaf holding on to a branch, as if defying the odds. I considered a time in my life when I was hanging by an emotional thread and even though there were people about, I felt like a deserted island in a sea of loneliness. Maybe you can recall a period of grief or loss when you had similar feelings. Did you reach out to share your struggles? Were you met with one of these platitudes?

Well-Meaning Platitudes

It'll be alright • Everything turns out at the end Look at it this way, it could be far worse God never gives you more than you can handle I know how you feel • Time heals all wounds Don't worry • Bad things happen to good people Since it's God's will, it's probably for the best Don't let it get you down • This too shall pass You need to put this behind you and move on



Compassionate Responses Hang in there • Jesus loves you and so do I I'm by your side for as long as you need I'm listening • That's what friends are for Would you like me to contact a pastor? God is faithful, a rock in sinking sand You'll be in my prayers • Allow me to help You are not alone • You can count on me I'll check in with you soon • Keep the faith

Although, most likely unintentional, any of these platitudes could be construed as flippant, which may tempt the recipient to draw further into their cocoon. It doesn't matter whether these responses are delivered by a family member, close friend or colleague. The reaction is the same, "Ouch." As God's people, Jesus teaches us in Matthew 11:33, "No one after lighting a lamp puts it in a cellar or under a basket, but on a stand, so that those who enter may see the light." In this season of Epiphany, let us be reminded that we are called to be the light of Christ, supporting those who suffer and rejoicing with those who rejoice.

The Gathering

Every Thursday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the Youth Room, Zion volunteers spend the day with a group of people from our congregation and our community experiencing early stages of dementia and other memory loss diseases. This group is called *The Gathering*.

This is a well-organized program that is provided by Anoka County Family Caregiver Connection and staffed by volunteers of the Zion congregation. The day is spent visiting, doing crafts, exercising, and learning about whatever the topic for the day is covering. Laughs and good fellowship are the orders of the day. While this is going on, the caregivers for these people are given a valuable break from the day-to-day stress involved with caring for a loved one and the client is given a chance to interact on a comfortable social level with people that care.

Local Schools Need Our Help

For many years Zion has been in partnership with Anoka Middle School for the Arts and Lincoln Elementary School helping in whatever ways we can – most recently we collected snacks for Lincoln. We have since added another local school to that partnership, Sandburg Regional High School. Sandburg (formerly Crossroads Main) creates an environment that honors and invites students of diverse backgrounds to be part of an inclusive learning community. Their small size allows them to form important relationships that not only help academic success but promote students' gifts and talents as they plan for their future careers and college pursuits. It is also a school that focuses on the individual student while still providing a rigorous diploma program using the Anoka-Hennepin School District's high school curriculum. Like Lincoln, they need individually wrapped items such as: Goldfish, Veggie Straws, Pirates Booty, granola bars without nuts, Rice Krispies Treats, Scooby Snacks, cheesy sandwich crackers and any allergy friendly/gluten free options (brands like Partake or Made Good). Sandburg also needs personal hygiene products like deodorant and feminine hygiene products (pads & tampons).

Snack donations for both schools and personal hygiene products for Sandburg can be dropped off at Zion's front desk during normal office hours. A printed list of requested items is also available for you to pick up. Thank you for your help!

Salt Alert

Using salt on your sidewalk and driveway is a balancing act - you want to be safe and prevent accidents, but salt can harm plants and animals and is corrosive. One teaspoon of salt can permanently pollute five gallons of water.

Five Winter Salting Tips from the Minnesota Star Tribune

- Use an ice scraper on ice build up.
- Shovel as soon as possible after snowfall to prevent build up of ice.
- Use sand when it is below 15 degrees.
- Limit salt to a coffee cup to 10 sidewalk squares.
- Sweep up excess salt.

From the Zion Addiction and Awareness Ministry (ZAAM)

ZAAM continues to grow in knowledge, possibilities and awareness of the effects of alcohol and drug abuse and to share that information. A reminder of the posters located on the 1st floor bulletin board and in restrooms; "Are you worried about someone's drinking?" with pull tab references to the Al-Anon phone number. On Sunday, March 16, ZAAM will sponsor the 10 a.m. Adult Faith Forum with guest speaker, Sheri Cindrish, the President and founder of Recovery Café. This organization offers hope, information, and direction about drugs, alcohol and mental health issues affecting self, family and our community.

Members of ZAAM visited with staff and toured the Minneapolis location of Teen and Adult Challenge, a Christianfocused drug and alcohol treatment facility. They were very impressed with the options, program and staff. Watch for more information in the future about this organization.

Some facts and education

- 1. The American Association for Cancer Research found that excess levels of alcohol increase the risk for 6 different types of cancer.
- 2. Signs of a 'borderline alcoholic': People who appear as functional but still drink excessively, sometimes struggling to realize they might have a problem in the first place.
- 3. Anoka-Hennepin School District is hosting a Drug and Alcohol Awareness series aimed at substance use by teens, Tuesday, February 28, 7-9 p.m. at Anoka High School showing the film event, *Chasing the Dragon*, an FBI produced film exploring opioid addiction. On Tuesday, April 19, there will be a presentation event at Andover High School, with panels of substance-use experts and first-hand accounts from students.
