a message from your pastors



As we approach the pinnacle of the Christian calendar, Holy Week and Easter, it is essential for us to reflect deeply on the significance of these sacred days. Holy Week is not just a series of events; it is the heart of our faith, the story of God's profound love for humanity, and the ultimate triumph of life over death. This time invites us to examine our lives, our relationship with God, and our understanding of the hope that Easter brings. Holy Week begins with **Palm Sunday**, when we celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. The crowds waved palm branches and shouted "Hosanna!" recognizing Him as the Messiah. However, as the week

progresses, the tone shifts from celebration to sorrow. On **Maundy Thursday**, we remember the Last Supper and Jesus' act of servanthood as He washed the disciples' feet. It is a reminder of Christ's command to love one another as He has loved us. **Good Friday** marks the somber day of Jesus' crucifixion. The significance of this day cannot be overstated. On the cross, Jesus bore the weight of the world's sin, offering Himself as the ultimate sacrifice for humanity's redemption. This moment is one of great sorrow but also profound gratitude. We are reminded that through His suffering, Jesus reconciled us to the Father, making a way for us to experience forgiveness and eternal life. It is a day for Christians to meditate on the depth of God's love and to reflect on the cost of our salvation. After the sorrow of Good Friday, **Easter Sunday** emerges as a day of victory and joy. Easter is the celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus, the most glorious event in Christian history. Jesus' resurrection is not just the foundation of our faith but the source of our hope. It demonstrates that death does not have the final word. Through His triumph over the grave, Jesus offers the promise of eternal life. Easter is the ultimate symbol of God's power to renew, restore, and bring life where there was once death.

As we celebrate these moments, let us hold fast to the words of the angel at the empty tomb: "He is not here; He has risen, just as He said" (Matthew 28:6). May we live in the reality of the resurrection every day, shining the light of Christ in a world that desperately needs His hope.

Shake the Tree of Faith

Toddlers think they are so clever, like when they get ready to throw a toy, but get your attention first; you shake your head 'no' and they toss it anyway. Then they run away and hide because to them, it's a game. Sometimes, as God's children we act like this toddler in that, rather than listen to God's guidance, we act in a way that we know, deep down, displeases God. When this happens, it's easier to distance ourselves from God than to seek forgiveness.

"So, he (Jesus) told them this parable, 'What man of you, having a hundred sheep, if he has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open country, and go after the one that is lost, until he finds it? And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing." Luke 15:4-5. We are not told the 'why' behind the lost sheep's dilemma. Maybe he was a loner and lost track of time. Maybe he was hurt and couldn't keep up with the others. But we are privy to what happens next. Counting only 99 sheep the shepherd is absolutely compelled to find the missing sheep and doesn't return to his flock empty handed or empty shouldered, if you may. I can envision a noisy reunion as the 99 sheep in the fold bleated their 'welcome home' message with delight.

There is a quote by Martin Luther that clearly mirrors this parable. He states, "First I shake the whole apple tree, that the ripest might fall. Then I climb the tree and shake each limb, and then each twig, and then I look under each leaf." Our Lord knows exactly where we are on our faith journey. Maybe we are ripe to answer God's call and ready to bring glory to our God in all that we do. But, if we are hiding with shame under a leaf, the Lord will search endlessly to return us to the fold and all God's people will rejoice!

MN Adult and Teen Challenge Choir - May 4

Zion will host the MN Adult and Teen Challenge choir at the 11 a.m. worship service on May 4. The choir has been invited by Zion's Addiction Awareness Ministry (ZAAM) to share their music and testimony as part of a service centered around the theme of recovery. The mission of MN Adult and Teen Challenge is to assist men, women, and teens in gaining freedom from chemical addictions and other life-controlling problems by addressing their physical, emotional, and spiritual needs. They offer effective and affordable programs throughout Minnesota with campuses in Minneapolis, Brainerd, Duluth, Mankato, Rochester, and Buffalo. They provide a wide range of treatment and recovery programs such as Outpatient (Telehealth and In-person), Licensed Residential (45-90 days), Long Term Recovery Program (12 months), Teen Residential (6-12 months), and Ongoing Recovery and Alumni Services, enabling them to effectively serve individuals with various addiction issues—from those seeking treatment for the first time to those who have been struggling with addiction for many years. Recovery worship services offer our faith community an environment where everyone can find strength, healing, and encouragement. A freewill offering for MN Adult and Teen Challenge will be taken after the service to support this wonderful ministry.

Recovery Café Anoka County Opens at Zion

Recovery Café Anoka County opens its doors on April 2, 2025 in partnership with Zion Lutheran Church as a recovery support community for those struggling with homelessness, addiction, and other mental health challenges. We are committed to providing a safe healing space. We believe everyone needs to know that they are loved and have gifts to share. We thrive to implement equity, trauma-informed healing, family stability and self-sufficiency.

Due to the opioid epidemic, and the increase of mental health and addiction in our communities we want to bring a loving and safe place where people can support each other and connect as a community. The café will be open on Mondays & Wednesdays from 9:30 a.m.-4 p.m. Our plan is to bring members to the café, located at Zion Lutheran Church in Anoka 1601 S. 4th Ave Anoka MN 55303 where we will be utilizing space to participate in the following free programs:

- Weekly Peer Support Circles
- Hot meals and coffee Free Lunch 11 a.m.-1 p.m.
- School of Recovery (Life Skills Courses, Health & Wellness Courses, etc.)
- Sports Activities/Leagues
- Resource Library (housing, job, health, culturally specific materials, etc.)
- Community Outreach

Co-Founder/Executive Director, Sheri Cindrich says, "Healing doesn't mean the damage never existed, it means the damage no longer controls our lives."

Visitors are welcome and membership is free!

Anyone interested in joining as a member of Recovery Café Anoka County must:

- Be drug and alcohol free 24 hours before coming on site
- Attend a peer support Recovery Circle weekly
- Empower every member to contribute to the community

Recovery Café Anoka County is an Emerging Member of the Recovery Café Network (RCN). As an RCN Emerging Member, Recovery Café Anoka County joins a learning cohort with other groups starting Recovery Café. Over two years, they receive mentorship, materials, expertise, and facilitated learning experiences. The Recovery Café Network helps them build a foundation of long-term recovery support and change the conversation around addiction, other mental health challenges and homelessness.

The Recovery Café model began in Seattle in 2004 and an increase in requests from groups for guidance to start recovery support centers in their own cities led to the creation of the Recovery Café Network in 2016. The Recovery Café Network (www.recoverycafenetwork.org) uses a social licensing model in its replication efforts and now has over 77 Member sites nationwide, including Recovery Café Anoka County.

From the Rachel Circle - Alexandra House

Alexandra House is a non-profit located in Blaine that provides domestic, sexual and relationship violence services to women, men, youth and families across the state of Minnesota. It is the only 24 hour emergency shelter in Anoka County. **65% of domestic violence survivors** have a pet and nearly half of the victims stay in abusive situations rather than leave their pet behind. Many abusers threaten to injure or kill a pet as a means of control. **As of January 13**, Alexandra House opened Linus' Pet Haven as part of the services they offer. They can now house up to 6 pets with indoor and outdoor spaces. As this new program expands, their need for support will be both immediate and ongoing. **To donate** go to https://www.alexandrahouse.org/, click on the magnifying glass and enter Linus' Pet Haven in the search bar.
